





AUDITING PUBLIC SAFETY

Identify, Measure and Improve What Needs to be Examined and Improved in Your Agency?

Internal Affairs cases, damage claims and consent decrees are not natural consequences of good police work, but they have become all too frequent consequences. Fortunately, you can do things to mitigate and prevent performance that brings re-work, frustration and damaged reputations. It's called auditing and it is not something that must be done by outside investigators **after** one incident or a series of systemic failures. You can develop the skills to initiate on-going audits of your agency's most impactful behaviors. Auditing can help your agency avoid the iceberg **before** impact.
